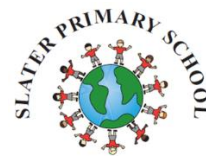

Discussion Points

- The roads outside of school (Frog Island and Slater Street) can be dangerous – too many cars and a lot of traffic.
- Suggestions to make the roads safer for pupils at Slater Primary School:
 - Reduce speed limit
 - Pedestrian crossing
 - Zebra crossing
 - Safe places to park on Slater Street
 - Drop off zones on Slater Street
 - More cameras to monitor traffic and/or fine drivers for parking on double yellow lines outside of school
 - More “pencils” (bollards) along Slater Street to stop cars parking
 - Remind parents of the expectations
 - Encourage families to use public transport
 - Contact local council and MP
 - Complete research to support a campaign to make changes
 - Start a petition to reinstate a crossing near school and/or a new zebra crossing outside school
- More equipment is needed at lunchtimes
- Offer other games at lunchtimes, e.g.
 - A board games club (or similar) in a classroom for pupils to sign up to
 - Use the astroturf for different sports each day
 - Ask families and nearby businesses if they can donate any board games (or similar) for use at wet playtimes
- Have a sign up sheet for the ‘Book Nook’ at lunchtimes
- Put a suggestion box in classrooms or around school for pupils to add to throughout the school week
- Fundraising ideas for equipment
- Can mats be used in the hall for packed lunches and/or assembly times?
- Is there a better way or place to have packed lunches inside?

- Christmas:
 - Decorate classrooms
 - Some Christmas competitions, e.g. a Christmas box design competition
 - Santa’s Grotto for pupils to visit
 - Gifts delivered by Santa, e.g. selection boxes
 - Christmas parties – classes or key stages
 - Christmas performances
 - Christmas dinner – how does it work at school?
 - Invite people from One Church to talk to us more about Christmas
 - Secret Santa for pupils
 - Every class to have their own Christmas tree
 - Christmas tree in the hall that school councillors can help decorate

	Organize Christmas competitions (e.g., box design)	
	Plan Santa’s Grotto and arrange gifts	
	Schedule Christmas parties by class or key stage	
	Coordinate Christmas performances	
	Confirm logistics for Christmas dinner
